ANSWERING THE CALL

I am reminded daily of how many pets and the people who love them rely on the Sacramento SPCA to say yes in times of need – and how often we answer that call.


When we began construction on the Zoe K. McCrea Animal Health Center in 2020, our goals were to expand community access to low-cost spay/neuter and wellness services and become a beacon of hope for animals that arrive at the shelter with special medical needs.

We've achieved this and much more in our first three years of operation – annually performing more than 20,000 spay/ neuter surgeries, administering more than 48,000 vaccines, and providing critical interventions for one in four animals coming through our doors, such as Minnie, an eight-year-old terrier who was surrendered by her owner. The shy senior, weighing just four pounds, had severe periodontal disease and needed our help.

We have also taken on a vital role in supporting other shelters. The veterinary and support staff shortages affecting animal welfare have left many organizations unable to provide the care that some animals urgently need. In response, we have welcomed medical transfers from these shelters, providing a safe haven and the specialized care they require, like a fracture repair for 7-month-old Sawyer, featured on the cover of this issue.

This is made possible thanks to our generous community of individual supporters and donor-supported health funds:

IN 2023, THE SACRAMENTO SPCA TRANSFERRED IN 487 ANIMALS FROM OTHER SHELTERS TO HELP SAVE LIVES IN OUR COMMUNITY AND BEYOND.

Normally, these transfer animals are brought to the SPCA to immediately go up for adoption when our partner shelters are overcrowded, or in times of disaster relief, to provide space for other shelters to house animals affected by natural disasters.

With our state-of-the-art Zoe K. McCrea Animal Health Center in full operation, we are now seeing an increase in shelters contacting us for support with animals in need of above and beyond medical care. Adorable puppy Sawyer is just one of those animals!

In May of this year, the Napa County Animal Shelter received a stray 7-month-old "Doodle" puppy with a broken leg.

The expenses to treat his injury were too much for their shelter to take on, so they contacted the rescue team at the Sacramento SPCA so he could receive specialized care to save his leg.







We immediately said "yes!" and arranged for transport to Sacramento.

Imagine our surprise when Sawyer arrived and he was not a Doodle...but an Old English Sheepdog mix (a breed we do not see very often at shelters!)

Upon arrival, we performed x-rays to confirm the injury and develop a plan for treatment. We reached out to our friend and veterinary partner Dr. Le-Nguyen for advice and he confirmed that Sawyer needed surgery and agreed to assist.

OUR PARTNERSHIP WITH DR. LE HAS HELPED SIX ANIMALS WITH FRACTURED LIMBS SO FAR IN 2024. EACH SURGERY COSTS APPROXIMATELY \$1,500 -AN EXPENSE WE CAN SAY YES TO THANKS TO YOUR SUPPORT!

In addition to a neuter, Sawyer received a plate and screws on

his femur and needed six to eight weeks of recuperation. Time to call upon our amazing foster parents!

Two passionate volunteers were interested in fostering this adorable muppet through recovery and he was sent to foster shortly after surgery. He spent about two weeks in foster care with volunteer Angela, who made sure to keep him calm and quiet as he recuperated.

While Sawyer recuperated in Angela's home, the other volunteer interested in fostering couldn't quite get him out of her mind.

Manina, who in addition to volunteering as a foster parent has also been part of our Kong Brigade and We Pay to Spay program, visited Sawyer while he was in foster with Angela and helped babysit him when needed.

After Sawyer's first recheck went well, we learned he wouldn't be heading back to the shelter for adoption - Manina wanted to adopt him!

Since Sawyer still needed additional follow-up visits, we

transferred the foster care over and continued to monitor his progress. After his recheck x-rays showed everything was healing well, Manina and her wife Cathy completed the adoption. Sawyer's new family includes Sacramento SPCA alumni Philly, the super senior Terrier, and Piper and Izzy, two

cats who declined to comment for this article.

Sawyer has already cemented his place in the family, and they hope to have him enrolled in our Love on Loan therapy program due to his calm, loving nature. It took a village to save this happy puppy and we cannot wait to see what's in store for him!

LEARNING THROUGH CREATIVITY

As summer vacation came to an end and students returned to school, the Sacramento SPCA closed another heartfelt chapter of Summer Camp Kindness programming at the shelter.

Throughout the months of June to August, more than 130 students between the ages of 7 to 15 participated in our 3-day summer sessions of Camp Kindness, a program that invites the community's youth into the shelter to learn about and interact with the animals in our care.

This year, Camp Kindness revitalized its youth curriculum to focus on the utilization of storytelling as a creative method of education. The pairing of storytelling and instructional time allowed the program to emphasize each camper's creativity and enhance comprehension through the completion of The Shelter Story Project.

The Shelter Story Project is a seven-page storybook in which students describe and depict the journey of an animal through the shelter system. Students were tasked with using their imagination to create a story that utilizes the information they

learned about the various ways the Sacramento SPCA provides care for animals at the shelter.

Paired with the instruction campers received each day about intake, animal care, medical and behavior support, and adoption at the Sacramento SPCA, students were asked to complete the first two pages of their story on day one by detailing how the animal arrived at the shelter and how they were feeling.

The next few pages discussed types of enrichment that animals received during their time at the shelter, such as walks, volunteer socialization, toys, and treats. Campers then chose which enrichment activities they wanted to include in their story. This was followed by a discussion of the variety of

medical support the animals receive at the shelter, including vaccines, medication, and surgeries.

On their final day of camp, students completed their Shelter Story with a description of their animal's adoption profile. Here, students explained what kind of family would be the best fit for their animal. The Shelter Story Project was a successful new tool used to reinforce what the campers learned each day about how the Sacramento SPCA helps animals in our community. Each unique story reminded the campers, teen volunteers, and staff of the heartfelt connections made with animals and people during their camp experience.
